Dance Masters of America's Teachers Training School wishes to express our sincere appreciation to our attendees for their loyal support as we celebrate the programs Fifty-fourth year.

TTS was established at the turn of the century because DMA wanted to offer its members and future members a professional program that provides both basic and advanced teaching techniques for all Dance Educators. The focus of the program is on education, where attendees learn proven teaching principles, fundamental dance techniques, build a core dance syllabus, and methods for successfully applying these skills in the classroom.

Although the Dance Masters of America has always included a program for the training of dance educators into their curriculum, it wasn't until 1970 when it was moved to Kent State University where it evolved into the program known as the "Dance Masters of America Teachers Training School." To accommodate the rapidly growing enrollment and to further enhance the program, Dance Masters of America Teachers Training School was moved to the beautiful facilities of the State University of New York at Buffalo's Center for the Arts in 1998.

Once again to accommodate enrollment as well as enhance the program, TTS moved to Ball State University in 2024. Master teachers instruct classes in teaching techniques for all disciplines of dance: ballet, tap, jazz, modern, lyrical, theatre dance, Hip Hop, and specialty classes.

Object Statement

Successful completion of the FOUR-YEAR PROGRAM and examinations result in Dance Masters of America certification in dance education, where teachers are certified by test to teach (see requirements below). Membership is available through a chapter.

Age Requirement - Student must be 18 years of age as of the first day of the program to participate in the TTS program.

<u>Teachers Training School Placement Requirements:</u>

- Attendees cannot move to the next level if more than 4 years has lapsed between grades.
- Attendees must complete grade 4 (testing not required) in a 7-year period.

| Graduate: | | Successfully completed Grade 1, 2, 3 & 4; successfully passed 4 core subject examinations. Graduates shall receive a Teachers Training School Diploma. When returning will register as a Graduate. |

Special Note to All Attendees

Assessments & Exams

Grade 1, 2, & 3 will be given assessments. This assessment will be used to evaluate the course and to help you prepare for Grade 4 exams. These assessments are returned to you in each of the last classes on the last day. There are no grades recorded.

Grade 4 may be examined in the core subject of their choice. These examinations may be used for membership into Dance Masters of America.

Attendance

Attendance is mandatory for all classes. Students are allowed three excused absences that must be evaluated by the administration. Any absences beyond three will prevent the student from receiving certification for that current level. NO ONE WILL BE EXCUSED FROM THE LAST THREE CLASSES OF THE PROGRAM. Tardiness: Students are to be at all classes on time and checked in for attendance before the class begins. Three tardiness will result in one absence. 5 minutes late is considered tardy.

TTS attendees will be given attendance certificates at the end of the late class. These will NOT be mailed. Those testing in Grade 4 will be recognized during the Student Honors Intensive Program the evening of the last day.

Classes

Classes will be located on the Ball State Campus.

Classroom decorum

Proper classroom decorum must be shown at all times. Example: Excessive talking, gum chewing, disrespect towards faculty, poor attitude, use of foul language are not acceptable. If found in violation you will be asked to leave the class resulting in an absence, and possible expulsion from the program with no refund or credit.

Dress Code

All participants must be attired under the following guidelines:

Dancewear: should be modest and in good taste. Cover-ups should be worn outside the classroom.

Long hair must be tied back for all classes.

Appropriate shoes for each class (no socks in place of shoes).

Housing

Staying on campus is not required. Residence Halls will be available for all TTS attendees. Name and location of residence halls will be on the DMA website and in an email sent to attendees as we get closer to the arrival date. Please keep checking the website.

Bathrooms in the residence halls are pod style with a certain number of rooms assigned to each pod.

- Check-in for the dorm is between 1:30PM and 9:00PM.
- Provided in the dorm room:

Pillow, pillowcase, 2 flat sheets, light weight blanket, 1 face towel,

1 bath towel, cup, soap. There is no sheet or towel exchange.

- There are no refrigerators available for rent.
- If you stay in the residence hall you are responsible for cleaning out your room, including garbage before leaving.
- Keys will be turned into dorm staff as follows:
 - If checking out after the Showcase on July 25 it must be done by 9:00PM.
 - If checking out on July 26 it must be done by 9:00AM.
 - Charge for lost keys: \$55.00.
- Laundry there are washers and dryers in the residence hall. They require quarters or you can also download an app and pay thru there.

Meals

Meals are not included in your registration and can be purchased in one of the designated dining halls or in "The Village". Attendees will need a method of payment (cash/credit/debit card) to purchase meals. Please note campus dining halls may not be open on the weekends.

Orientation Meeting

There is a mandatory orientation meeting, July 21st at 7:45AM for all levels in the Ball Gym Building in the KDS studio.

There is NO Packet Pick-up this year for TTS attendees.

NEW THIS YEAR: Once registration is closed and payments are received, each attendee will receive an email with their grade level study guide. Attendees are encouraged to download/print for use in classes.

At the orientation meeting we will hand out name badges which are required to attend classes. A photo ID is required to pick up your name badge.

Parking Fee

If driving on campus you will be required to purchase a parking pass for \$20.00. Parking is in designated areas only. Parking passes are not available on site, they are pre-order by May 1st only.

Participation

Students ages 18 and older are to fully participate in all classes unless a written excuse has been evaluated by the Administration. If injured after registration and before June 1, the student is to notify the National Treasurer before making travel plans. All written excuses must be supported by a doctor's recommendation for participation. All pregnant students must have a certificate from their doctor allowing them to fully participate in the program.
